Master CREOLE

The International Master in Social and Cultural Anthropology, called « CREOLE - Cultural Differences and Transnational Processes », brings together 7 European universities:

- National University of Ireland Maynooth
- University of Vienna, Austria
- Autonomous University of Barcelona, Spain
- University of Ljubljana, Slovenia
- University of Bern, Switzerland
- Adam Mickiewicz University, Poznań, Poland
- University Lumière Lyon 2, France

This Master is organised in 2 years (M1 + M2 of the French system), therefore students wishing to integrate this Master must apply to the First Year (M1 in the French system). You will first attend courses in your “home university” (the one you are applying to, in this case, Lyon) and will then enrol for at least 2 semesters (S2-S3) in one/two “host universities” (partner universities of the Master).

This master focuses on 4 main thematic domains of Anthropology:

- Transnationalism and mobility
- Cultural diversity and New identities
- Material Culture and Consumption
- Visual Culture

Please note: This is a European Master which main language is English. A large part of the courses will take place in this language, and the Master Thesis will have to be written in English. It is therefore necessary, when you apply, to have a level sufficient to understand the courses and write a 100-pages long thesis in that language.

Conditions of admittance:

Deadline for Applications: upcoming date. Application process takes place on-line, via e-candidat.

In addition to the administrative application, candidates will need to prepare the following documents:

- A résumé (CV) (in English or in French);
- A cover letter (in English and in French), explaining why you apply, in which Partner universities do you intend to go, and why;
- A research project;

- An official document (TOEFL, certificate, etc.) certifying a level B1 (minimum) in English.
- For non native French speakers, an official document certifying a level B1 (minimum) in French

In addition, be honest when you are writing the above-mentioned documents, this will permit us to figure out your written level. In other words, do not have someone else write/translate the documents for you.

Applications will be evaluated by an Educational Commission, and ranked (Principal admissions and waiting list). The Commission might invite the candidates for an additional interview in order to clarify some elements of their applications, in particular their English/French language abilities.
